If the election is invalid or not 14 held at that time, the election to fill the vacancy shall be held at the next 15 succeeding general election. 16 17 When Max Baucus resigned from the senate to become ambassador to 18 China, he was serving a term that expires at noon on 3 January. Governor 19 Bullock appointed John Walsh to fill the vacancy. The next general election 20 was scheduled for 4 November 2014. 21 22 But the 4 November 2014 election did not includ a special election to fill 23 the remainder of the Baucus/Walsh term that expires at noon on 3 January 24 2015. 25 26 Instead, the 4 November 2014 ballot included an election to fill the senate 27 term beginning after noon on 3 January 2015 and expiring at noon on 3 28 January 2021. 29 30 31 (2) The governor may make a temporary appointment to fill the vacancy until the 32 election. 33 34 This section is ambiguous. There are at least three interpretations: 35 36 37 **One.** The time frame in which the governor can make the appointment opens with the creation of the vacancy and closes at 38 the next general election. That makes little sense, however, because 39 except on Election Day, it's always before the next general election. 40 41 **Two.** The duration of the temporary appointment extends only to 42 the next general election, whether or not a special election to fill the 43

remainder of the term is held.

45 **Three.** The appointment extends to the special election to fill the 46 47 vacancy. If there is no special election at the next general election, the appointed senator continues to serve until the next general 48 election or the expiration of the term, whichever comes first. 49 50 51 Interpretation Three of (2) makes the most sense to me. No special election was 52 called, therefore Walsh's appointment remains valid and ends on 3 January 2015 at 53 noon EST. 54 55 Bullock's an attorney, and by most accounts a very good administrator. He 56 probably prepared, or had prepared for him, a legal memorandum explaining his 57 options. I suspect one option was to fill the vacancy by appointment, but not to 58 seek a special election given the term expired two months after the general 59 election. That's a reasonable decision. 60
