## **Practice Background: Attorney-Advocate Raph Graybill**

Graybill serves as Chief Legal Counsel to Montana Governor Steve Bullock. In that capacity, he has led or participated in cases before the United States Supreme Court, the Montana Supreme Court, the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, and state and federal trial courts in Montana.

Representative cases (non-exhaustive):

- *Bullock v. Fox* (Montana Supreme Court) (lead counsel in public access case concerning Habitat Montana program)
- *Bullock v. Internal Revenue Service* (U.S. District Court) (lead counsel in nationwide suit to set aside illegal IRS activity that benefitted dark money campaign organizations)
- *Espinoza v. Montana Department of Revenue* (U.S. Supreme Court) (merits counsel defending Montana Constitution in challenge to no-aid clause)
- *Montana Smoke Free Association v. Bullock* (Montana District Court) (lead counsel securing nationally-significant ruling upholding emergency restriction on flavored e-cigarettes)
- *Bullock v. Stapleton* (Montana District Court) (lead counsel in mandamus proceeding against Secretary of State to recognize veto)
- *Janus v. AFSCME* (U.S. Supreme Court) (amicus counsel in case defending collective bargaining rights for public sector employees)

As Chief Legal Counsel, Graybill counsels the Governor, his staff, and the directors and legal counsel for thirteen cabinet agencies on litigation, legal policy, judicial appointments, executive orders, disaster and emergency services, ethics and regulatory compliance, administrative law proceedings, legislation, and a wide range of other matters. He is the principal liaison between the Montana Attorney General's Office and the executive branch of Montana's state government.

Prior to joining the Governor's office, Graybill was an attorney for Susman Godfrey, LLP.<sup>1</sup> In private practice, Graybill represented clients nationwide in complex commercial litigation. His last case before joining the Governor's office culminated in a month-long complex civil trial in which Raph represented a whistleblower to possible securities fraud.

Graybill also served as a judicial law clerk to Chief Judge Sidney R. Thomas of the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in Billings, MT. The Ninth Circuit oversees federal appeals for the entire Western United States. As a law clerk, Graybill assisted the Chief Judge with legal research and drafting relating to cases of nationwide significance.
